A Message from the Board

As Compass Credit Union enters the year 2011, our 45th year of doing business, we can look

back on 2010 and be proud of our accomplishments. Loan growth increased 10 percent over the previous year. Membership grew substantially, up 9 percent over 2010. Our rates remained competitive, even with the larger financial institutions in the area. Overall, the financial health of our credit union stayed strong, despite

an economy that continues to struggle.

Sometimes, however, achieving our goals requires difficult decisions. That was the case with our west-side branch at 7 Fourth Ave., in Hillside Commons, which will close by the end of March. Simply put, the small amount of business we generated at this branch did not support the cost of paying for staff and leasing the space. After examining the issue – and trying our best to generate more business at this location over the past few years – the Compass staff and Board of Directors decided it was no longer feasible to continue this service. Instead, a committee has been formed to examine other locations for Compass, ones that will better serve our members.

We hope you will understand the reasoning behind our decision, and we hope you will accept our sincere apologies for the inconvenience this will create for our loyal west-side members. Originally, the Hillside branch was built to address the inconveniences created by the two major bridge repairs in Oswego. We had hoped those repairs would generate enough business to keep the office open, even after the repairs were complete. Unfortunately, that was not the case.

On a brighter note, we at Compass feel fortunate about our success in 2010 and would like to thank you, our members, for making that possible. We look forward to serving you in 2011 and wish you and your loved ones all the best in the New Year.

New Compass office opens on first floor of Oswego Hospital

A fter more than three decades of being located on the third floor of Oswego Hospital, Compass moved in November to a new office on the first floor, near the cafeteria.

The move means Compass is more centrally located to hundreds of hospital employees. Workers can stop by to cash their checks, make deposits, apply for loans, check balances, buy stamps or use any other service the credit union provides.
